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Integrated Project Delivery is Coming to Eastern Canada

On January 23rd Craig Webber (IPDA President) and Dan Drouin (IPDA Board Member) represented the IPDA in a meeting with the General Director of the Strategy and Special Projects Directorate branch of the Society Québécoise of Infrastructures. This meeting, arranged through the Corporation of General Contractors of Quebec, presented the IPD process and its contractual characteristics.

Discussions centered around topics such as how IPD combines the principles of Lean management, a collaborative team, alignment with the values of the owner and a contract structure that targets improved results of construction projects. This integrated project delivery method debuted in Western Canada 6 years ago and has been gaining momentum ever since.

During this historic meeting Craig explained the added values of the IPD contract in the context of modern construction, more specifically by citing examples such as; the multi-party contract, (including at minimum the Owner, the Prime Consultant and the General Contractor), and involves a single amount contract that includes contingency, profit at risk for the partners of the agreement, guaranteed costs for the partners based on audits, shared savings if the project is executed within budget, implementation of Lean concepts, practices and tools, as well as the intentional creation of a collaborative culture.

Les discussions ont porté sur des sujets tels que la façon dont IPD combine les principes de la gestion Lean, une équipe collaborative, l'alignement avec les valeurs du propriétaire et une structure de contrat qui vise à améliorer les résultats des projets de construction. Cette méthode intégrée de livraison de projets a fait ses débuts dans l'Ouest canadien il y a 6 ans et n'a cessé de croître depuis.

Au cours de cette réunion historique, Craig a expliqué les valeurs ajoutées du contrat IPD dans le contexte de la construction moderne, plus précisément en citant des exemples tels que; le contrat multipartite (comprenant au minimum le propriétaire, le consultant principal et l'entrepreneur général), et implique un contrat d'un montant unique qui comprend les imprévus, le bénéfice à risque pour les partenaires de l'accord, les coûts garantis pour les partenaires sur la base d'audits, des économies partagées si le projet est exécuté dans les limites du budget, la mise en œuvre de concepts, pratiques et outils Lean, ainsi que la création intentionnelle d'une culture collaborative.
